Valley Forward's Livability Summit will be held on Earth Day to promote "healthy living in the desert."

The fifth annual Livability Summit will be April 22 at the Phoenix Convention Center. The goal of the event is to showcase a positive impact on health, improve the environment, and educate the community.
